



## **E.F. "Gene" Hubbard, PE, CFM**

**Director, Facilities Engineering and Real Property Division  
National Aeronautics and Space Administration**

Gene Hubbard joined NASA as the Director of the Facilities Engineering and Real Property Division in February 2002. Mr. Hubbard works out of NASA Headquarters in Washington DC, and is responsible for setting NASA policy for facilities maintenance, repair and construction, and real estate management, as well as for programming and managing funding for major repair and construction projects.

Prior to joining NASA, Mr. Hubbard spent most of his career as a commissioned officer in the Civil Engineer Corps, U.S. Navy. He held assignments in construction management and public works management across the United States and overseas in Keflavik, Iceland. Mr. Hubbard also held positions in the Pentagon, and spent a year as a Congressional Fellow working for a Congressman in the House of Representatives. Upon retiring from the Navy after more than 20 years, he took a position as the Coordinator of Administration and Program Support for the Office of Adult and Community Education, Fairfax County Public Schools.

Mr. Hubbard received a B.S. degree in chemistry from the U. S. Naval Academy in 1980. He earned a Master of Engineering degree in civil engineering from the University of Florida in 1988 and a Master of Public Administration degree from Troy State University in 1998.

Mr. Hubbard is a licensed Professional Engineer in the states of Florida and Virginia, is a Certified Facilities Manager, and is a member of several professional organizations, including the International Facilities Management Association, the Society of American Military Engineers, and the American Society of Public Administration.
